When people talk about how much they use their phone, or how their phone has replaced their computer, apps are the reason why. Apps make your smartphone easy, fun and versatile.

An app, short for application, is a software program that allows you to perform a specific task or set of tasks. Your phone came with some apps ready to use, but being able to **download** (add to phone) additional apps to your phone allows you to customize what you can do with your phone based on your interests, tasks you need to do, services you frequently use and so much more! The best part is that apps are often free and always easy to get.

# Connect Through Tech

## Introduction

Selecting, downloading and installing apps is a quick, easy and often inexpensive way to make your phone the best device for your own individual needs.

Android users get their apps from the Google Play Store, which is easily accessible from any Android phone. There are applications for anything you can imagine (and even things you can't!) This guide will show you how to navigate through the Play Store, give you a few suggestions on apps, and show you how to get an app onto your phone and ready for you to use.

Many apps are free and some need to be purchased. Some apps are free to add to your phone and use basic features, but also offer the option of additional features that require a payment. This guide will show you how to understand the cost of an app before you choose it.

Once you choose an app, the next step is to **download** it (add to your phone). When downloading a free app, it is recommended to use a Wi-Fi connection, rather than a cellular connection. Downloading an app can take much

longer with a cellular connection and will use data from your mobile phone plan.

To protect your financial information when downloading an app you must pay for (most apps are free), you should only use a **secure Wi-Fi** or your cellular connection. A **secure Wi-Fi** means a Wi-Fi that **only you** know the password to access it. This is the opposite of public Wi-Fi networks where all patrons are given the same password or there is no password required, such as at *Starbucks* and the *NY Public Library*.

### Creating a Google Account


To be able to **download** (add to phone) new apps, you will need a Google Account. If you didn't create one when setting up your phone, refer to the guide *Creating a Google Account*.

### If You Forget Your Google Account Password

Step 1. **Click** (tap) on Settings icon (picture)



Step 2. Scroll down to **click** (tap) on *Google*.

Step 3. **Click** (tap) on *Manage your Google Account*.



### If You Forget Your Google Acct Password (continued)

Step 4. Scroll to right on top menu (e.g. Home, Personal Info etc.) until you see *Security*, then **click** (tap) on *Security*.



Step 5. Under *Signing in to Google*, **click** (tap) on *Password*.

### If You Forget Your Google Acct Password (continued)

Step 6. **Click** (tap) on *Forgot password*.



Step 8. **Click** (tap) Yes.






## Connect Through Tech

### If You Forget Your Google Acct Password (continued)

Step 9. **Enter** (type) a new password of at least 8 characters in both boxes shown below, then scroll down and **click** (tap) on *Next*.

### If You Forget Your Google Acct Password (continued)

Step 10. **Enter** (type) your new password again to confirm your password change, then **click** (tap) *Change Password*. (NOTE – If Google tells you have already used this password, choose a different one.)



Step 11. Your password is changed. (NOTE - Reviewing your recovery info and security settings are optional.)







## Finding Apps in the Play Store

Shopping for new apps is fun! The Google Play Store provides access to over 2 million software programs (apps) designed to run on Android mobile devices.

- In order to select the right apps for you, you will find out what's available
- Check reviews and pricing (many are free!)

The next few sections will walk you through these steps. To access the Play Store, **click** (tap) on *Play Store*.




NOTE: This **icon** (picture) may be in a different location on your screen. If the **icon** (picture) is the same, it doesn't matter where it appears.

## Finding What's Available – Search

Step 1. The most direct way to look for apps is to use the **Search icon** (picture) to look for apps that are of most interest to you. **Click** (tap) on *Search for apps & games*.






## Connect Through Tech

### Finding What's Available – Search (continued)

Step 2. **Enter** (type) name of app if you know it, like “NY Times.” You can also type a more general word that describes the kind of app you wish to find, like “newspaper” or “news.” A list of options will appear. **Click** (tap) on desired app to review it. This is like window shopping – looking, not acquiring.





## Connect Through Tech

### Finding What's Available – Search (continued)

Step 3. From this screen, you can view how others have rated the app (3.6 of 5) and how many have downloaded it (over 10,000). Scroll down to learn about other similar apps



### Finding What's Available – *Apps* Button

Instead of using the *Search* button, another option is to use the *Apps* button, also located at the bottom of the first screen after opening the Play Store. This screen is very busy and will contain many advertisements for apps of different types.

Step 1. **Click** (tap) on *Apps*.



### Finding What's Available - Apps Button (continued)

Step 2. From the top menu, **click** (tap) on *Top Charts* or *Categories*





## Finding What's Available - Apps Button (continued)

*Top Charts* (shown on left) will list the most popular apps and can be filtered further by selecting headings such as *Top Free* and *Top Paid* (scroll right to view all).

*Categories* (shown on right) will allow you to browse by type of apps that you are most interested in.





## Connect Through Tech

### Finding What's Available – Other Options

You can also get app recommendations from friends and family. Ask them to explain what apps they find it useful and to demonstrate how they work. Then you can look get them in the Play Store as has just been described.

Below are some widely used apps. Please note that DOROT does not recommend specific apps.

- a. Want to stay in touch with friends and family by phone, video calls or chat: *WhatsApp* or *Skype*
  
- b. Looking to plan your trip and to view status of bus and subway lines in New York City: *MyMTA*
  
- c. Interested in listening to your favorite music: *Pandora* or *Spotify*
  
- d. Enjoy reading books and magazines, even from the library: *Amazon Kindle*



## Connect Through Tech

### Reviews and Pricing

Once you find an app you might be interested in using, it is recommended to check how people have rated the app and confirm its price, if any, before adding to your phone.

Below the app name, you can always see the review information – how many stars and how many people reviewed the app.

While most apps are free, some require an initial payment to download. Other apps can be downloaded for free but accessing some features will require a one-time or ongoing payment. Below are examples to show the differences.



### Reviews and Pricing (continued)

#### FREE APPS

*TED* (below) is an example of a free app. You can tell it is free because on the right side of the screen it says *GET*. Below the app name, you can see the review information – *TED* has received 4 of 5 stars from 1,780 users. **Click** (tap) on *Install* to **download** (add to phone).





### Reviews and Pricing (continued)

#### FREE DOWNLOAD / PURCHASE FOR FULL USE

*Netflix* (below) is free to download by **clicking** (tapping) *Install*. Below the app name in small letters, is a notation *In-App purchases* (circled). This means that some or all features require payment after the free download. *Netflix* app requires a monthly subscription. *Netflix* has received 4.5 of 5 stars and has been downloaded over 500,000 times. **Click** (tap) on *Install* to **download** (add to phone).

### Reviews and Pricing (continued)

#### PAY TO DOWNLOAD and USE

You see this price in the same place where *Install* is on free apps. *TouchRetouch* (below) requires an **initial payment** of \$1.99. After that it is free to use. Many apps requiring purchase are in this price range. **Click** (tap) on price to **download** (add to phone).



### Reviews and Pricing (continued)

Other times you might see *Open* where the price is supposed to be. This indicates an app that is already on your phone. You can see this in the example below, for *Gmail*. **Click** (tap) *Open* to access the app.

## **Downloading Apps**


After you have searched for and selected your app, you are ready to download. The download process will differ, depending on whether the app is free or requires an initial payment. Review sections below for a walk through of each process.

## Downloading Free Apps

Step 1. Free apps are downloaded immediately by **clicking** (tapping) on *Install* for *MYmta*.



### Downloading Free Apps (continued)

Step 2. While download is in progress, you will see a green revolving circle **icon** (picture). When done, **click** (tap) *Open* to start the app.






# Connect Through Tech

## Downloading Paid Apps

Step 1. Apps requiring any kind of payment are downloaded by clicking *Install* (for apps with in-app purchases, shown on left) or the price (for apps that require initial payment, shown on right). **Click** (tap) on \$1.99 to begin download of *TouchRetouch*.






## Connect Through Tech

### Downloading Paid Apps (continued)

Step 2. To proceed with the **download** (add to phone) of *TouchRetouch*, **click** (tap) on *Continue*.






## Connect Through Tech

### Downloading Paid Apps (continued)

Step 3. To continue with purchase, you will need to add a payment method to your Google Account. Saving credit card information to your Google Account is not required but will be needed to **download** (add to phone) paid apps or to purchase premium features within free apps. Enter requested information.






## Connect Through Tech

### Downloading Paid Apps (continued)

Step 4. After adding credit card information, **click** (tap) on *Buy*.






## Connect Through Tech

### Downloading Paid Apps (continued)

Step 5. After entering credit card information, you may need to enter your Google Account password to continue.

**Click** (tap) *Verify* to continue.






## Connect Through Tech

### Downloading Paid Apps (continued)

Step 6. **Click** (tap) *Yes, always* and *OK* on the two screens that follow.






## Connect Through Tech

### Downloading Paid Apps (continued)


Step 7. Download will begin. When done, **click** (tap) on *Open* to begin using your new app.



## Connect Through Tech

### Downloading Paid Apps (continued)


Step 8. If you change your mind, **click** (tap) on *Refund* to reverse the transaction and uninstall the app.



## Connect Through Tech

### Downloading Paid Apps (continued)

Step 9. After requesting a refund, the purchase price will reappear, showing that *TouchRetouch* has been removed.
